

Hezekiah did not have a “Domestic Passover”

-- - 2-Kings 18, 2-Chron 29 & 30

(cy-Numbers are Creation Year, from Jubilee-Count.pdf)

cy3229 Ahaz son of Jotham ruled 16yrs with Urijah who found the Temple corrupted & closed it

cy3231 Pekah took captives of Naphtali within Israel to Assyria (2-K 15:29 to 16:1)

cy3231 **Book of Obadiah** (Prophecy of Zion against Teman of Esau)

cy3238 **Apocrypha-Tobit** (Tobias born to Tobit & Anna)

cy3241 Hoshea son of Elah conspired with 40 priests & killed Pekah; - Hoshea Israel king 9yrs

cy3244, ma-597, 15th Jubilee, 830BC, Olympiad 47, Hezekiah began & ruled 29 years

cy3244, **Book of Hosea** Ends (Prophecy of Syria carrying all Israel, & Samaria is desolate)

cy3244, **Book of Micah** (Rebukes Samaria & Jerusalem practicing wickedness of Ahab & Omri)

cy3244, Hezekiah son of Ahaz, removed the high places, and brake the images, and cut down the groves, and brake in pieces broke the brazen serpent that Moses had made (2-Kin 18:4-5)

Hezekiah ruled 29 years. On his first year, he opened the temple to cleanse on 1st month, but priests had not finished sanctify & cleansing until the 16th day. (2-Chron 29:17-19)

Therefore they kept Passover on 2nd month.

On 2nd month, 14th day, they killed the Passover, & gathered the people. Prayed, & kept the feast of unleavened bread seven days with great gladness. (2-Chron 30:15-21)

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Passover Requirements

No male not circumcised of strangers or of the congregation shall eat the Passover

On the 14th at evening to the 21st day at evening shall be no leaven seen (Ex 12:18)

You will not sacrifice the Passover within any of the gates

Leave none of it to the morning, nor break any bone of it;

10th Day take a lamb without blemish, a male of the first year; from the sheep or the goats.

Keep it until the 14th day; and the congregation shall kill it in the evening.

1st month on 14th evening the sacrifice is killed (Ex 12:6)

Eat that Night roasted by fire with unleavened bread and bitter herbs (Ex 12:8)

Let nothing remain in the morning; all that remains shall burn with fire (Ex 12:10)

Follow Script – Not Tradition

The whole lamb is roasted with skin & innards, no bones broken

Roasted outside the gate, if too much, share after roasting, no bone broken

Eat while clothed, shoes on your feet, and your staff in your hand

Nothing Remains – this is not a feast of all manner of foods

Only the roasted lamb & unleavened bread & bitter herbs & drink

All that remains will be burned by fire before anyone leaves in the morning

Nothing shall be taken out of the house

Exodus left homes unoccupied – any food or drink remaining would spoil or feed rodents & bugs

Pesach-Passover of Exodus-12

2 This month shall be the beginning of months; the first month of the year to you.

3 On the **tenth day** of Abib, **take a lamb** for a house.

4 If the household is too little for the lamb, let him and his neighbor next to his house take it according to the number of souls; every man according to his eating shall make count for the lamb.

5 Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male of the first year; you shall take it out from the sheep, or from the goats.

6 **Keep it until the fourteenth day**; and the congregation of Israel shall **kill it in the evening**.

7 Take the blood and strike it on the two side posts and the upper doorpost of the houses wherein they shall eat it.

8 **Eat the flesh in that night, roast with fire and unleavened bread and bitter herbs.**

9 Eat it neither raw, nor sodden with water, but **roast with fire**; his head with his legs and with the pertinence thereof.

10 **Let nothing remain until the morning**; and **that which remains you shall burn with fire**.

11 Eat it with your loins girded, your shoes on your feet, and your staff in your hand, and eat it in haste; **it is the LORD's Passover**.

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14 This day shall be a memorial, a feast to the LORD throughout your generations; you shall keep this feast as an ordinance forever.

15 **Seven days shall you eat unleavened bread**; even the first day, put away leaven out of your houses; for **whosoever eats leavened bread from the first day until the seventh day**, that soul **shall be cut off**.

16 The **first day and the seventh day** shall be a holy **convocation** to you; no manner of work shall be done in them, save that which every man must eat, that only may be done of you.

17 Observe the feast of unleavened bread this day in your generations, by **ordinance forever**.

18 In the **first month, on the fourteenth day at evening**, you shall eat unleavened bread **until the twenty-first day of the month at evening**.

19 Seven days shall there be no leaven found in your houses; for whosoever eats that which is leavened, that soul shall be cut off from the congregation of Israel, whether he be a stranger or born in the land.

20 You shall eat nothing leavened; in all your habitations eat unleavened bread.

- 24 Observe this thing for an ordinance to you and to your sons forever.

- 26 When your children say to you: What is meant by this service?

27 You shall say: **It is the sacrifice of the LORD's Passover, who passed over the houses of the children of Israel in Egypt**, when he smote the Egyptians, and delivered our houses.

- 42 It is a night to be much observed to the LORD for bringing them out from the land of Egypt; this is that night of the LORD to be observed of all the children of Israel in their generations.

43 This is the ordinance of the Passover: There shall **no stranger eat thereof**.

44 But every servant **when circumcised**; then shall he eat thereof.

45 A foreigner and a hired servant shall not eat thereof.

46 In one house shall it be eaten; you **shall not carry any of the flesh out of the house or break a bone thereof**.

47 All the congregation of Israel shall keep it.

48 And **when strangers sojourn with you and keep the Passover to the LORD**, let **all males be circumcised**, and then let him keep it, and be as one that is born in the land; for **no uncircumcised person shall eat thereof**.

Pesach-Passover of Exodus-13

5 You shall keep this service in this month of Abib.

6 Seven days you shall eat unleavened bread, and the seventh day shall be a feast to the LORD.

7 Unleavened bread shall be eaten seven days, and there shall be no leavened bread seen with you, neither shall there be leaven seen with you in all your quarters.

8 And you shall show your son on that day, saying this is done because of that which the LORD did, when he came out of Egypt.

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10 Therefore keep this ordinance in his season from year to year.

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16 And it shall be a sign to you upon your hand, and a memorial between your eyes, that the LORD's law may be in your mouth; for with a strong hand, the LORD came out of Egypt.

Pesach-Passover of Exodus-34

18 The Seven days feast of unleavened bread you shall keep in the time of the month Abib.

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25 You shall not offer the blood of sacrifice with leaven; neither shall the sacrifice of the feast of the Passover be left to the morning.

Pesach-Passover of Leviticus-23

5 The fourteenth day of the first month at evening is the LORD's Passover.

6 The fifteenth day of the same month is the feast of unleavened bread unto the LORD; seven days you must eat unleavened bread.

7 The first day is a holy convocation; do no servile work therein.

8 You shall offer unto the LORD seven days; in the seventh day is a holy convocation; you shall do no servile work therein.

Pesach-Passover of Numbers-9

3 On the fourteenth day of the month, at evening, you shall keep it in his appointed season, according to all the rites and ceremonies thereof shall you keep it.

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10 If any man is unclean by reason of a dead body or a journey a far off, he shall keep the Passover to the LORD.

11 The fourteenth day of the second month at evening, keep it; eat it with unleavened bread and bitter herbs. [Observe on second month if unclean on first month]

12 Leave none of it to the morning, nor break any bone of it; according to the ordinance of the Passover.

13 But the man that is clean and is not on a journey, and forbears to keep the Passover; the same soul shall be cut off from his people, because he brought no offering of the LORD in his appointed season; that man shall bear his sin.

14 And if a stranger sojourn among you, and will keep the Passover to the LORD according to the ordinance and to the manner thereof; so shall he do; you shall have one ordinance, both for the stranger, and for him that was born in the land.

Pesach-Passover of Deuteronomy-16

- 1 Observe the month of Abib, and keep the Passover to the Lord your God.
- 2 Sacrifice the Passover of the flock and herd in the place which the LORD shall choose to place his name.
- 3 Eat no leavened bread with it; seven days shall you eat unleavened bread, so you may remember the day when Israel came out of Egypt, all the days of your life.
- 4 There shall be no leavened bread seen in all your coast for seven days; neither shall there be any thing of the sacrifice remain all night until the morning.
- 5 You may not sacrifice the Passover within any of the gates which the Lord your God gave you.
- 6 But at the place which the Lord your God shall choose to place his name; there you shall sacrifice the Passover at the going down of the sun, at the season that Israel came out of Egypt.
- 7 And roast and eat it in the place which the Lord your God shall choose; and you shall turn in the morning, and go to your tents.
- 8 Six days you shall eat unleavened bread, and on the seventh day shall be a solemn assembly to the Lord your God; you shall do no work the seventh day.

End of Pesach-Passover Verses

Priest Temple duties were excluded Those are Temple Only & Levite Only duties

Shema - Deuteronomy 6 thru 13

The Shema of Testimonies and Obligations; is essentially the honorable promises or prayer to **Yahweh**, that Moses had all Hebrews and Strangers observing the Covenant of Israel, to pledge at the Feast.

Then some traditionally follow with the Prayer of Moses.
